First Year Bowler Rawson Claims 3 Local Tenpin Titles



First year bowler Megan Rawson, who averages 114 in league, won the Canadian Lakehead Tenpin Association 44th Annual handicap singles' crown, Doubles and the All-Events titles.

Her 688 total (403+285 pins handicap) in singles and averaging 134 for the three games, was 60 pins over her 114 league average and two pins better than runnerup, Joe Kolodziejczak's 769 (652+117). Placing third was Brian McLean.



In the doubles event, Rawson teamed up with Mitchell Parker, also a first year tenpinner, to win her second Association title with a combined score of 1442 (926+516), just three pins better than the runnerup team of Di Nakonechny and Ken Martyn's 1439 total. Nakonechny rolled a 648 scratch total and Martyn a

662. They had 129 pins handicap. Third place was won by the team of Ken Chepesiuk and Bill Graham with a 1427 total (1340+87).

For the All-Events title, which includes the nine games plus handicap, she rolled 403 in singles, 414 in doubles and a 479 in the team event, plus her handicap, was 56 pins better than runner up Anne Saasto's 2095. Rawson will be awarded the "*PETER FUCHEK MEMORIAL PLAQUE*" for this accomplishment.

Ken Chepesiuk, with his nine game scratch total of 1946, an average of 216, won the "GEORGE DRABEK MEMORIAL PLAQUE" by one pin over Bill Graham, last years All-Events Champion.



The team of Ken Chepesiuk (643), Stephan Larocque (694), Bill Graham (705), and Ken Martyn (618) rolled a 2858 total (2660+198) to take the Team Event.

Other notable triple scores were rolled were by Ken Chepesiuk 716 in doubles and 643 in team, Bill Graham 624 in doubles and 705 in team, Brian McLean a pair of 632's in singles and doubles, Doug Kukko 640 in doubles, Glen St.Onge 621 in doubles, Anne Saasto 629 in team, Linda Cella 640 in team, Lionel Laprade 665 in team, Joe Kolodziejczak 652 in singles and James Shperuk 620 in singles and 673 in team.

Notable singles were rolled by Joe Kolodziejczak, a 236 in singles and James Shperuk's 226 also in the singles event and Stephane Larocque's 278 which was the highest game rolled.

High scratch doubles series was by Chepesiuk and Graham with a 1340 that included a 471 game and the team champions, Graham, Chepesiuk, Martyn and Larocque, posted the high game of 937.
